

WHAT IS PROTECTED?

Home address, home telephone number, personal mobile telephone number, personal e-mail, personal photographs, directions to the home of a protected person, photographs of the home or vehicle of a protected person.

EXEMPT PARTIES

An exempt party may access a record that includes information otherwise subject to redaction pursuant to subsection (2.8) (b), and that is maintained by the county recorder, county assessor, or county treasurer, if the person seeking access to the record provides evidence and an affirmation under penalty of perjury that they are an exempt party.

C.R.S. § 18-9-313 (2.8)(c-d).

PRIVACY PROTECTIONS FOR OCR ATTORNEYS

House bill 22-1041 provides OCR attorneys and their staff with the ability to withhold personal information from the internet if the attorney believes disseminiation of such information poses an immediate and serious threat.

REQUIREMENTS

The protected person must make a written request to a state or local government official to remove their personal information. C.R.S. § 18-9-313 (2.8)(a)&(b). The request must include:

- Protected person's full name and home address.
- Evidence that the person submitting the request is a protected person.
- An affirmation under penalty of perjury that the person making the request has reason to believe that the dissemination of the personal information poses an imminent and serious threat to the person's safety or the safety of the person's immediate family.
